Manchester City v Southampton

Edin Dzeko has scored in two of his three Barclays Premier League games against Southamptor The Saints have won five and lost three of their last 10 Barclays Premier League games against Manchester City, but have lost their last two visits to the Etihad Stadium.

Aston Villa v Fulham

There have been just six goals scored in the last five Barclays Premier
League meetings between Fulham and Aston Villa.
Bad news for rock-bottom Fulham though as the Cottagers have won none
of their last 14 away games in the league at Villa Park (L7 D7).

Cardiff City v Crystal Palace

Cardiff have conceded the highest proportion of goals in the final 15 minutes of Barclays Premier League matches this season (34%). Crystal Palace, however, have won none of their last nine visits to Cardiff City in all competitions (D4 L5).

Hull City vs Swansea City

Hull City have seen the joint-most opposition players sent off this season (6) along with Norwich City.

Swansea have won none of their last five league visits to play the Tigers, losing four of those games.

5 April 2014

Newcastle United vs Manchester United

After going 18 Barclays Premier League games without a win against
Manchester United (D5 L13), Newcastle have won two of the last four (W2 L2).
Wayne Rooney has scored six goals in his last six Barclays Premier League
appearances.

Norwich City vs West Bromwich Albion

West Brom have won three of their last four league trips to Carrow Road but lost in the Barclays Premier League there last season 0-4 (W3 L1).

Chelsea vs Stoke City

After winning eight and losing none of the first 10 Barclays Premier League meetings with Stoke City, Chelsea lost the last encounter earlier this season 2-3 to the Potters. Stoke managed to score as many goals in their last match against Chelsea as they had managed in the previous 10 Premier League meetings (3).

6 April 2014

Everton vs Arsena

Everton have only scored more than once in one of the last 22 Barclays Premier League games against Arsenal.

The Gunner, however, have won just three of their last 10 Barclays Premier League matches (W3 D4 L3), taking just 13 points from the last 30 available.

West Ham United vs Liverpool

There have been three own goals in the last three Barclays Premier League meetings between the Hammers and the Reds.

Glen Johnson has scored in three of his last five Barclays Premier League games against former club West Ham, including the last two trips to the Boleyn Ground.

7 April 2014

Tottenham Hotspur vs Sunderland

Tottenham have won five and lost none of the last seven Barclays Premier
League games against Sunderland.
Sunderland have scored a league-high 46.4% of their Barclays Premier League
goals from set pieces this season.

Joe HART

- Team: Man. City
- Position: Goalkeeper
- Value: £6.0m
- Selected by: 6.7%

Before Manchester City's 1-1 draw at the Emirates Stadium against Arsenal last week, Joe Hart has helped the Citizens claim five consecutive clean sheets, helping himself to 32 points in the process.

The English international, who endured a shaky start to the season, have found his reliable form back that easily made him the league's best keeper for the previous three season.

With a steady amount of players transferring Hart into their rosters since Gameweek 25, it's only going to take one or two more impressive displays in between the sticks before his price tag rises up again.

Even though a rise of £0.1m might not seem significant in blatant digits, when you're running low on funds, £0.1m can mean the difference between Demba Ba and Luis Suárez.

Besides, five of their remaining eight fixtures are played at the Etihad Stadium, where home advantage counts massively ahead of their clash against rampant Liverpool, which should more or less decide the outcome of the current season.

A calm, collected and experienced manager like Manuel Pelligrini will not allow any margins for errors and slip-ups in a nervy run-up of games, not when the Premier League crown is at stake.

With Joe Hart in great form at the moment as well, it's safe to assume that City will perform even better than previous weeks, with four or five clean sheets a distinct possibility in the final stretch of the season. >>

Jon FLANAGAN

- Team: Liverpool

Jon Flanagan, who never played a big part in his previous three seasons at Anfield, have suddenly been thrusted into the spotlight this year.

His 1406 minutes for Liverpool this season in the Premier League is nearly twice the total of his playing time in the young English fullback's four-year stay at the Merseyside club.

Flanagan, who started every game for the Reds since Gameweek 22, have been an unexpected revelation so far.

Although wobbly and hesitant at times, Flanagan has already created 11 key chances for the Reds, Glen Johnson being the only defender to have created more.

For a price point of £4.4m and a meagre selection rate of 1.7%, Flanagan looks to be value-for-money for a place on your bench, or even your starting lineup if you're willing to take the risk when a high-profile defender in your roster is grossly underachieving.

However, the Reds have two important matches in their remaining six games, against Manchester City and Chelsea, both home encounters, in Gameweek 34 and 36 respectively.

With little experience against the big guns, I wouldn't be surprised if Flanagan falls short against the two heavyweight teams, especially when Jesus Navas and Samir Nasri are in fine shape at the moment.

Other than these two teams though, their remaining adversaries should be easily dealt with.

For me personally, it's still quite a gamble at this stage of the game, so if you want to get Flanagan, please make sure you get your other areas covered and have sufficient backup to lead you through to the end of the season.

Flanagan will be a good alternative if you decide to utilise only three defenders in every gameweek. With Hull City's Liam Rosenior (£4.0m), the duo will make a good backup in your substitutes bench, who can both deliver points when counted upon. >>

Aaron LENNON

It's easy to see why Lennon needs to go.

With a high price tag of £7.1m, he's not playing exceptionally well, at least not well enough to justify that hefty price tag.

His performances isn't that bad statswise. He has a perfect shooting accuracy, and a decent passing accuracy of 85%.

However, soccer is a team sport, and unfortunately, due to his teammates' incompetence and ill positioning, he has not been able to perform to the best of his abilities, and the key chances he's been carving have been on a steady decline in recent weeks.

Tottenham hasn't been playing well at all, losing four of their last six games.

Against Sunderland, it seems unlikely that Spurs will trouble Vito Mannone much.

Matches against West Brom, Fulham, and Stoke follow.

The Baggies are draw kings, having drawn a stunning 14 games this season in the Premier League.

Fulham have nothing to lose, and that's a pretty scary thing, speaking from personal experience.

Stoke is in great form at the moment, with Peter Crouch and Peter Odemwingie delivering the goods, and along with their physicality and their new sleek passing game under Tony Pulis, it's hard to see them getting much out of all three matches.

Besides, Roberto Soldado, Emanuel Adebayor and Jermaine Defoe are all injured, leaving 20 year-old Harry Kane the only fit first-team forward for Spurs.

Without quality support at the front, it is highly unlikely that Lennon will get himself any assists, or goals for that matter.

Oh, have I mentioned, that £7.1m price tag is just ridiculous.

Some better alternatives will include his teammate Christian Eriksen (£6.5m), inform Cardiff midfielder Jordon Mutch (£4.8m), Norwich City's Robert Snodgrass (£5.9m), and Swansea's Jonathan de Guzman (£5.2m). >>

Hmm, paying £5.8m for a defender that hasn't played in five weeks.

Shrewd.

Normally, I wouldn't really recommend getting rid of players if it's a really straightforward decision, but I've made an exception this time because 13.3% of you guys still have him in your squad.

I shall lay out some stats as per a good journalist would.

Jagielka has made an average of 12 defensive actions per game, more than any other player in the squad, with the exception of Antolin Alcarez (13), who have only played in three of Everton's matches in the Premier League this season.

The 1.83m tall defender also registered an average pass length of 24m, the longest amongst Everton's outfield players.

His passing accuracy of 87% is even more than Chelsea's Eden Hazard (83%), and Liverpool's Steven Gerrard (86%).

But what's the point if he's not playing?

Get rid of Jagielka as soon as possible and invest in other alternatives such as Martin Demichelis (Manchester City, £5.9m), Martin Skrtel (Liverpool, £5.9m), Glen Johnson (Liverpool, £5.7m) or Steven Caulker (Cardiff City, £5.2m).

Heck, anyone would do.

Seriously, the 13.3% of you.

Even with home support, rampant Liverpool will look forward to another opportunity to extend their goal difference past Manchester City, who they will be facing in a few weeks time.

The previous time these two sides met, Liverpool clinched a one-sided 4-1 victory at Anfield, courtesy of a world class display from the Uruguayan, who scored once and assisted twice.

Despite the change of venue this time round, don't be surprised if Liverpool run riot at Upton Park on Sunday.

And who else better to lead the annihilation than Luis, Alberto, Suárez.


